Like the rest of her "numbers family," Melissa Wright was good at math. But that didn't stop her Jamaican immigrant parents from worrying that her passion for social justice would lead to a career of noble poverty. "My parents were always joking, 'We're going to have to support you forever," recalled Wright.

Fortunately, that didn't happen. Wright now combines her quantitative and empathetic abilities as Philadelphia's director for data and policy, "telling the stories behind the numbers," as she puts it. At the Office of Economic Opportunity, she works with minority, disabled and other underrepresented Philadelphia business owners seeking city contracts. "I've spent a lot of time thinking about equity in all my work," reflected Wright, who previously collaborated on progress report data for the School District of Philadelphia.

That work also includes leadership with the League of Women Voters, where Wright heads the Philadelphia chapter, combatting voter apathy through programming that gives voters the local angle on Harrisburg. The onetime Fordham economics major is also the league's state treasurer – "the less sexy role," joked Wright.

In all her work, Wright aims for influence that doesn't take sides. "When you're advocating for equity across issues, one of the levers that you can pull is policy," she said. "And in today's world, so often, we are missing that nonpartisan lens."

~ INTERNATIONAL SELF CARE DAY ~



International Self-Care Day (ISD), is on the 24th of July each year. IS, provides a focus and opportunity to raise the profile of healthy lifestyle self-care programs around the world.

The ISD Date

The International Self-Care Day, 24 July, symbolizes that the benefits of self-care are experienced 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. In other words, the benefits of self-care are life-long and do not just relate to a single day. ISD on 24 July simply provides a good focus and opportunity to publicize or report on self-care in action programs.

Each year ISF (International Self-Care Foundation) proposes a general theme for International Self-Care Day. For 24 July 2017, the theme was 'Get better with Self-Care'. For 24 July 2018, the theme was 'Feel Good, 7/24'. Since 2019 there has been a choice of themes which can be used as appropriate:

- Self-Care is for Life.
- Get Better with Self-Care
- Treat yourself to better health

2020 is the start of a new decade for self-care, so in addition to previous themes the following can be used:

- Self-Care by all, for all
- The Self-Care 2020's
- Self-care for all. A New Decade

Since 2011 self-care activities linked to ISD have been organized around the world, in countries as far apart as Australia, Bangladesh, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, China, Iran, Kenya, Mexico, Myanmar, Nepal, South Africa, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Switzerland, Tanzania, the United States, the United Kingdom and Vietnam. Some countries – the UK and Canada – have organized self-care weeks.

ISD-related activities have been focused on youth (e.g. a poster design competition, mob flash dance, and concerts), seniors (community involvement programs, physical examination programs), the general public (public lectures, expert advice, sponsored public walks, football and golf matches, tai chi classes), occupational health, pharmacy (poster campaign, pharmacy manager training), research (on self-care habits and behavior), and the media (media events, newspaper and journal articles).

~ SUMMER HEAT ~

Summer is here and so is the HEAT!!!

Know when high temperatures may put your health at risk. Pay attention to the forecast regarding heat advisory or extreme heat warnings. Tips to stay safe.

- 1. Drink water or other fluids to help your body handle heat. Avoid alcohol, sugary drinks and caffeine.
- 2. Eat easy to digest foods: fruit or salads.
- Some medications affect your body's ability to deal with heat (high blood pressure, depression, anxiety and antipsychotic meds). Take your meds as prescribed. Discus concerns with your PMD
- 4. Take a cool bath/shower; dampen a cloth for a sponge bath to cool your body down.
- 5. Do outdoor activities when temperatures are lower, usually before 11 am or after 6 pm
- Take frequent breaks to rest and rehydrate in a shaded or airconditioned area.
- 7. Wear loose-fitting, lightweight and light-colored clothing.
- 8. Wear sunscreen and a hat when you're outdoors.
- 9. Know where to go if you cannot keep the temperature in your home below or around 80 degrees Fahrenheit (recommend temperature is 78 degrees F). Get to a cool air-conditioned place or shaded area.
- 10. Wet/dampen your skin with a towel or spray bottle, while using the fan to keep cool. (Fans can become less effective at cooling you down when the temperature is above 95 degrees F.)

Note: For most people, if your urine is light yellow to clear, you are well hydrated. If your urine is dark yellow to amber, you need to drink more.

If you are on fluid restriction, consult your doctor about how much water you should drink when it gets too hot. DO NOT ignore the signs and symptoms when your body is telling you it's too hot.

Heat Exhaustion or Heat Stroke?

<u>Heat Exhaustion</u>: feeling faint or dizzy, excessive sweating; cool, pale, clammy skin; nausea and vomiting, rapid, weak pulse; muscle cramps; headache; confusion.

<u>Heat Stroke</u>: No sweating; body temperature above 103 degrees; red, hot dry skin; nausea and vomiting, rapid strong pulse; may lose consciousness.

- Give fluids (water), if fully conscious. DO NOT give anything to drink if unconscious.
- b. Call 911
- Move to a cooler place and cool down with cool cloths; take a cool shower, use cold compress or give a bath.

Look out for each other and remember to check on your elderly neighbor(s) and your children.
