

HOLIDAY SHOPPING SAFETY TIPS

The busiest shopping time of the year is here. If you are one of the millions of holiday shoppers, take some extra precautions with your personal information and purchases to protect yourself. Consider these holiday shopping safety tips:

- Keep your purse close to your body or your wallet in an inside coat pocket or front pants pocket.
- Don't argue or fight over an item.
- Don't take your money out until asked and don't flash a lot of cash.
- Use only one credit card. Data breaches have occurred in the past at major retailers and credit card companies. Should something similar occur, you can reduce the risk of having multiple cards compromised.
- Save your receipts and monitor your credit card activity by reviewing your bill immediately or periodically checking the online app.
- Ask for help moving and loading large items if needed.
- If shopping with children, select a central location to meet in case you are separated. Teach kids how to ask a security guard or employee for help if they're lost.

MORE TIPS FROM THE EXPERTS:

 Banks, utilities and governmental agencies never call unannounced. They will typically send a letter or a text that requires a two-step verification. Don't trust anyone claiming to be from your bank or the government. Call instead to verify.

- Don't answer a call if you don't recognize the number. If it's legitimate, they will leave a message.
- If you receive a text or email from a government agency or a trusted business, don't open it. The crooks often "spook" messages to make them look like a real deal. Look up the business and contact them directly.
- Never click on hyperlinks in electronic messages. That could lead to a virus being planted in your device.
- Never give your personal or financial information in response to an unexpected request. Never give anyone your passwords.
- Resist pressure to act immediately. Check out the caller.
- Never pay with cryptocurrency or gift cards. Never deposit a check and send money to someone.
- If someone calls about a family member who needs help, call the family member directly.
- If you get an unexpected electronic notice of a bill or even a receipt, don't reply. Call the business directly.
- Report the fraud attempt to law enforcement. Also notify the bank, credit card company and any agency or business that had been part of the crime.
