JAMAICA W. I.

Marjorie Mendez is a powerhouse. Demure and so softspoken one would think, as the old saying goes, that 'butter wouldn't melt in her mouth.' Yet despite that persona, Marjorie is anything but soft. Consider her instead like the iron fist in a velvet glove. She explains it saying, "I know I present as a very soft-spoken person, but behind that soft-spoken person is a strong woman who can move mountains without any fear."

Marjorie was born in St. Ann, Jamaica and lived there for the majority of her life until she came to the U.S. After graduating from Ardenne High School in St. Andrew, at age 17, she began working as a teller at the Bank of Nova Scotia. The hours were long and grueling. Tellers worked 6 days a week, starting at 8:30 am, and long after the doors closed Marjorie and her co-workers could be found working until all the accounts had been tallied and the monies counted.

Marjorie worked in banking from age 17 to age 24. During that time, she was promoted to head teller, the person in charge of all the other tellers and responsible for tallying all the money that passed through the bank's doors.

In those days, Marjorie says, "We didn't have computers or calculators. We did all the counting by hand. This meant that when the inspectors came around something they did randomly without any notice—we would have to stay there and count until all the monies were counted. Despite counting by hand, everything had to balance to a cent. You would often find us there until 1 am in the morning, then going home, just to have to be back at the bank by 8:30 am.

At age 24 Marjorie resigned from banking to start a construction building block manufacturing company. She says, "I'm an entrepreneur by heart. I realized I loved my freedom. I do not like having a boss over me. I will be the top producer in any industry because I'm a workaholic, but if I'm not free I feel trapped."

Though she was quite young and a woman entering a male-dominated industry, Marjorie took a leap and started the business.

She operated her construction company successfully for 15 years, earning multiple contracts with the island's large hotels, and building her own quarry to crush the stones needed by builders.

Simultaneously she started several other successful ventures, investing heavily in real estate, starting a drapery business, and later a restaurant and bakery, while also becoming one of the top selling life insurance agents on the island.

While directing her businesses, Marjorie managed the needs of her growing family. She had met and married her husband while at the bank, and together they had three children.

In 1998, Marjorie and her family immigrated to Brooklyn, New York where she resumed her banking career. With multiple insurance and financial services' licenses under her belt, she became a consumer banker at HSBC Bank in Bay Ridge, Brooklyn. Later she became an Assistant Treasurer at Chase Bank in Canarsie. She excelled in both positions and became one of the bank's top producers in the majority Italian and Jewish communities. While working full-time at the bank, Marjorie attended college full-time at night and on the weekends.

Marjorie moved to Wellington, Florida in 2004 after one too many bitterly cold New York winters that saw her driving on slickened black ice and digging her car out of mounds of snow in order to go to work or drive home.

Upon moving to Florida, she obtained her real estate and brokerage licenses and opened a mortgage brokerage company which she operated for several years.

Today she works as a real estate agent with Keller Wiliams Realty Wellington, specializing in residential properties. She continues to shine as a top producer among their 240 agents.

Marjorie is the mother of three children and grandmother of six. She lives in Lake Worth and has been a CAFCI member for six years.

In business she says it has been her priority to leave her customers with a feeling of 'Wow!' at having received the best service possible.
