STAY SAFE DURING A HURRICANE

Stay Informed

- ✓ Pay attention to emergency information and alerts.
- ✓ If you live in a mandatory evacuation zone and local officials tell you to evacuate, do so immediately.

Dealing with the Weather

- Determine how best to protect yourself from high winds and flooding.
- ✓ Take refuge in a designated storm shelter or an interior room for high winds.
- ✓ Go to the highest level of the building if you are trapped by flooding. Do not climb into a closed attic. You may become trapped by rising flood water.
- Do not walk, swim or drive through flood waters. Turn Around. Don't Drown! Just six inches of fast-moving water can knock you down, and one foot of moving water can sweep your vehicle away.

RETURNING HOME AFTER A HURRICANE

- Pay attention to local officials for information and special instructions.
- Be careful during clean up. Wear protective clothing, use appropriate face coverings or masks if cleaning mold or other debris.
 People with asthma and other lung conditions and/or immune suppression should not enter buildings with indoor water leaks or mold growth that can be seen or smelled, even if these individuals are not allergic to mold. Children should not help with disaster cleanup work.
- Wear protective clothing and work with someone else.
- Do not touch electrical equipment if it is wet or if you are standing in water. If it is safe to do so, turn off electricity at the main breaker or fuse box to prevent electric shock.
- Do not wade in flood water, which can contain dangerous pathogens that cause illnesses. This water also can contain debris, chemicals, waste and wildlife. Underground or downed power lines also can electrically charge the water.
- Save phone calls for emergencies. Phone systems often are down or busy after a disaster. Use text messages or social media to communicate with family and friends.
- Document any property damage with photographs. Contact your insurance company for assistance.

Although the condominium referenced in April's newletter did not materilze, we got the opportunity to acquire another unit in the same building but fell \$100,000 short of being able to make an offer in time (there was another offer on the table when we looked at the unit). The Finance Committee met and looked at possible options of raising funds on a continuous basis to fund a mortgage and continuous expenses of owning a building. These options include operating a business as one of the means of paying any loans and funding the maintenance of the building. A business plan is being developed to be presented to the Board for discussion and approval.

~ CARIBBEAN HERITAGE MONTH ~

National Caribbean American Heritage Month is an entire month dedicated to recognizing the contributions of Caribbean immigrants to American culture and society. The entire month seeks to promote the rich culture of the Caribbean, and how Caribbean immigrants have been shaping the face of America for hundreds of years. Starting with the first-ever secretary of the treasury, Alexander Hamilton, who came from the Caribbean island of Nevis, many Caribbean immigrants and Caribbean Americans have changed the face of American government, culture, and entertainment. During this month, Americans are encouraged to honor the contributions of such figures and celebrate their achievements.

What happens during National Caribbean American Heritage Month? National Caribbean American Heritage Month is designated by presidential proclamation - meaning that the <u>president of the United States</u> leads the celebrations with an annual national proclamation about the importance of Caribbean culture to American society. The first National Caribbean American Heritage Month took place in June 2006, with President George Bush making the inaugural presidential proclamation.

There are also events held across the United States during the month of June which seek to promote the rich heritage of the Caribbean. One such event is National Caribbean American Restaurant Week, which runs from June 12 through June 18. This entire week promotes different restaurants across the United States that serve authentic Caribbean food.

Aside from celebratory events, there are also fundraisers and activistled events held to raise awareness about the systemic barriers that Caribbean Americans still face in the United States and empower the next generation of Caribbean Americans.

DID YOU KNOW ... THE FIRST BLACK SECRETARY OF THE U.S. ARMY WAS OF JAMAICA DECENT?

<u>Clifford Alexander, Jr.</u>, the son of a Jamaican immigrant, made history when United States President Jimmy Carter named him Secretary of the US Army in 1977, and he became the first African-American to serve in that role. Prior to his appointment by President Carter, Alexander had held various jobs, including time as a Private in the US National Guard, working in the Department of Foreign Affairs during the presidency of John F. Kennedy, and being one of the top civilian employees in the US Army.

~ JUNETEENTH ~

What is Juneteenth? Also known as Emancipation or Freedom Day, Juneteenth commemorates the end of slavery in the United States. The name "Juneteenth" references the date of the holiday, combining "June" and "nineteenth".

When was Juneteenth First Celebrated? Juneteenth was first celebrated in Texas, on June 19, 1866. It marked the first anniversary of the day enslaved Black individuals learned of the Emancipation Proclamation and that they were free. This was more than two years after it was first issued.

How was Juneteenth originally celebrated? In the years that followed, the first observation of Juneteenth celebrations typically included religious and prayer services, readings, speeches, sharing oral histories from former slaves, games, singing and feasting.

How do we recognize Juneteenth today? On June 16, 2021, legislation establishing the holiday with federal observance was passed by congress and the following day was signed into law by President Joseph Biden. While Juneteenth had previously been an established state holiday in Texas since 1980, it was not federally recognized. This year is the first time Juneteenth will be nationally observed with federal and school closures.

FLORIDA SALES TAX HOLIDAY

Consumers can purchase qualifying disaster preparedness supplies exempt from tax during the 2023 Disaster Preparedness Sales Tax Holiday. Passed by the Florida Legislature and signed into law by Gov. Ron DeSantis, the sales tax holiday began Saturday, May 27 and extends through Friday, June 9. A second exemption period will begin Saturday, August 26 and extend through Friday, September 8.
