HAVE YOU MET ... THE FERGUSON FAMILY?



This month we'd like to introduce you to the Ferguson family.

ORIGINS - Robin is Jamaican born and raised, while Micaela is from Columbia, South Carolina. The Fergusons, having lived in Florida previously, recently reestablished their Florida residency by moving from Virginia to Royal Palm Beach. They did so because they wanted to raise their children near family, a good many of whom reside in South Florida. A pragmatic duo driven by similar goals and beliefs, Micaela and Robin have always seemed to travel a parallel journey.

Their newest endeavor is gardening, and they are considering acquiring a few chickens as they recently purchased a home in The Acreage.

VALUES - Robin and Micaela say that their core values of continued faith and attention to health are essential to their household. Uplifting each other as a couple and their children as a family, while being good people, has been fundamental to building and maintaining their relationship. Having grown to adulthood in the military, they commend the service for having provided them and their family with opportunities to understand different cultures, and for expanding their exposure to real estate investing in different localities; that experience led to Micaela becoming a licensed realtor in Virginia and Florida and the start of their real estate business.

The Finance Committee is in the process of addressing our ability to show a more significant steady stream of income when obtaining financing for the purchase of property. This is one of the biggest hurdles we face in acquiring loan funding for a building and related capital expenses.

We have entered another phase in setting up a for-profit business as a means to some steady income, thanks to the knowledge and efforts of Barclay Varlack, a member of the Finance Committee and the Board.

The search for property continues, primarily focusing on lease to own options, along with land and commercial condominiums. Another option being investigated is jointly purchasing property that can be used by both parties, thereby reducing the cost of acquisition.

The business plan is required by the organization we have solicited to help us acquire funding for a building and related capital expenses. They will help us secure financing prior to finding a space.

THREE WAYS TO VOTE

EARLY VOTING: August 10 - 18, 2024, 7 am to 7 pm. You can vote in person or drop off your Vote-by-Mail ballot at any Early Voting location during this time.

VOTE-BY-MAIL: Voted ballots must be in the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections Office by 7 pm August 20. To receive a Vote-by-Mail ballot, you must request one. The deadline to request a Vote-by-Mail ballot is 5 pm August 8, 2024.

ELECTION DAY: August 20, 2024, 7 am to 7 pm To vote in person on Election Day, you must vote in the polling place assigned to your precinct.

CLOSED PRIMARIES

Your party affiliation will determine which partisan races are on your Primary Election ballot because Florida has closed primaries. However, the 2024 Primary Election also includes nonpartisan races for school board and judges, a countywide question, and a Universal Primary Contest* for Public Defender, 15th Judicial Circuit that all registered voters, including those registered with a different party or not affiliated with a party.

The deadline to change your political party affiliation for this election was July 22.

*A Universal Primary Contest occurs when all the candidates for an office belong to the same party and the winning candidate will have no opposition in the General Election.
